PARISH REGULATIONS

Sick calls, any time, any hour. Don't delay. Have two candles, crucifix, holy water and glass of fresh water, a napkin and a spoon on a table.

Baptisms to be arranged at least two days beforehand. Godparents must be practical Catholics.

Pew Rentals—Any adult, \$15.00. From the age of 18 to 21, inclusive, \$10.00. From school graduation to age of 13, rental is \$5.00. Every member of the parish should rent a seating. Rental payments can be made at convenience of pew holders. Each member should occupy the seat rented. Members over 70 exempted from pew rent.

Last pew in church is not rented, but kept open for visitors, the infirm, and for nursing mothers.

All parishioners are kindly requested to use small numbered envelopes each Sunday. Mark the amount of contributions plainly.

Confessions 4 until all heard, and 7 until all heard, each Saturday, and at 7 before each Holy Day. On first Fridays at 7:15 and before the Mass unless announced otherwise.

Children attending school MUST present a written excuse from parents after a brief absence—a doctor's certificate for a longer period.

All are to use the envelopes provided for offerings.

Register on entering the parish, call at rectory when leaving and obtain letter of introduction to pastor of new parochial residence.
